 - Federal, State and Local Governments, Private Companies and Non-Profit Organizations
 - Reduce Diesel Emissions in Midwest (Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio and Wisconsin)
- Leadership Group
 - Co-Chairs: Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, Cummins, American Lung Association-Upper Midwest
 - 33 Members Signed Collaborative Principles in January 2007
 - October 2007 Meeting
