

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# *USACE Environmental Workload Projections*

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## *USACE Support to Superfund*

- CERCLA legislation made provisions for the Superfund's programs use of the existing capabilities of other Federal agencies in meeting its objectives.
- EPA and USACE signed first agreement in 1982 to partner in executing Superfund mission



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## *USACE Support to Superfund*

- USACE executes Superfund projects that are identified, programmed and funded by HQEPA through ten EPA regions nationwide
- Over \$5B executed by USACE since 1982
- Most funds are for hazardous waste cleanup construction activities (remedial actions)



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# *USACE Support to Superfund*

- Through the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), USACE may be assigned the following:
  - Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study Activities
  - Remedial Design and Remedial Action Activities
  - Technical Assistance
  - Environmental Impact Statements
  - Obtaining Permits
  - Legal Determinations
  - Obtaining Real Estate




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# *ESFO - EPA Superfund*

## Work Types Distribution for FY07 New Funding



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# *Identifying Opportunities*

- Solicitations are advertised on FedBizOpps (website: [www.fbo.gov](http://www.fbo.gov) )
- In order to access FedBizOpps contractors must be registered on the Central Contractor Registration (CCR) database in order to access solicitation information. The CCR website is: [www.ccr.gov](http://www.ccr.gov)
- Local Corps Districts often identify contracting opportunities on the local Corps website (which can be accessed through the HQ U.S. Army Corps of Engineers website: [www.usace.army.mil](http://www.usace.army.mil))
- Local Corps small business offices can also provide information on regional contracting opportunities



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# *Solicitations*

- All contractors must be registered on the CCR database prior to accessing solicitation information. And registration requires:
  - Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) number provided by Dun & Bradstreet
  - Tax I.D. Number
  - Electronic Funds Transfer information
  - CAGE Code (if the federal government has already assigned your firm one)
- Solicitations are posted on FedBizOpps
- Contractors are also encouraged to provide On-line Representations and Certifications (ORCA) at the website: <http://orca.bpn.gov>



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## *Small Business*

- The Corps encourages use of set-asides, including 8(a), HUBZone, Service-disabled Veteran-owned Business (SDVOSB), and small business to maximum extent possible
- Small Business Specialists and Contracting personnel are more than willing to help new small business firms get introduced into the federal contracting process
- **65% of USACE contracts to execute Superfund work is awarded to Small Business**
- In FY07, USACE awarded 178M Superfund Contracts. 117M went to Small Business (prime not subcontracts)



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
