Recommendations from July 2005 PPDC Workgroup Meeting

- How to document Registration Review Decisions
 - Document be a high-level overview with links and references to the details
 - Clear description of any risk of concerns, mitigation and basis for decision

Recommendations from July 2005 PPDC Workgroup Meeting

- To what extent should end-use products be reviewed
 - Registration review is an opportunity for EPA to review all labels for an active ingredient for consistency
 - Routine label changes – provide 18 months for use of old labeling
 - For significant risk mitigation, EPA may require faster label changes to reflect necessary mitigation
 - Shortening timeframes may increase costs to industry
 - Consider supplemental labeling and stickering when possible

Proposed Rule Status

- July 13, 2005 – Published Proposed Rule
- October 11, 2005 – comment period ends
 - 15 public comments received

Registration Review Draft Schedule Released

- Posted August 3, 2006
- Focus was on first 4 years
- To achieve the 15-year review goal, average 44 cases a year
- Draft schedule is generally determined on chronological order while considering chemical classes and groups

Public Information Sessions

- EPA conducted two open public information meetings & a teleconference

Topics included

- Agency's goals & expectations for
- Process for conducting a review
- Proposed scheduling
- Comparison of reregistration & registration review.
- Stakeholder & public participation

Next Steps

- Review comments to proposed rule and make appropriate revisions
- Continue to develop internal procedures
- Summer 2006 – Issue Final Rule for Registration Review
- Fall 2006 – Begin implementation
