- Gain better understanding of stakeholder concerns, explore ways to address them



- [Other issues not directly related to GHS *per se*]



## Cost Considerations

- Much depends on implementation mechanisms and timing—tomorrow's discussion
- Specific costs mentioned in comments
  - relabeling, discarding existing label stocks
  - reclassification according to GHS criteria
  - label redesign
  - re-testing
  - fees (PRIA, states)



## Scope of Coverage/Building Block Issues

- Expand coverage to include more building blocks (e.g., chronic health hazard classes)
- Limit coverage to certain categories of pesticides (agricultural v. nonagricultural products, technical v. end products)
- Maintain or expand current exemptions (e.g., aquatic tox labeling for certain indoor residential use products)
