1. This bibliography is primarily intended to assist State, local governmental, and EPA staff access the growing body of literature related to environmental infrastructure sustainability. Emphasis is on materials which are available at no cost. Please note that several professional associations (e.g., Water Environment Federation, American Water Works Association) have additional excellent materials which are available for purchase. Please consult their websites for availability and pricing.
2. Region III intends to update this bibliography periodically. Note that the web addresses for materials download as current as of the date indicated as “update.”
  - Most of the documents have web “hot links.” If your browser doesn’t open automatically to the referenced cite, please copy and paste into your browser’s URL address bar. If the web address no longer works, please notify Region III of the new address (if possible). If you cannot locate the new web address, please advise Region III so that we might be able to assist in finding the material. Alternatively you may be able to locate a website with a downloadable version of the document by using one of the web search tools.
  - Please advise Region III of additional SI materials which you feel should be included in this bibliography. If possible, please provide the name of the document, organization, and (if available) the web address for document download.
  - If you need a copy of a document which is not downloadable from the web, please contact Region III.
3. The bibliography is organized into five sections: general and each of the four SI pillars (better management, full cost pricing, water use efficiency, and watershed approach). Several sections have sub-categories. Within each section materials are organized into five categories by type of material: (a) articles (which also generally includes magazine/journal articles, fact sheets, policy statements), (b) presentations, (c) publications, (d) tools (e.g., spreadsheets, bibliographies), and (e) websites. Please review each section. While an attempt was made to be consistent, in some cases, the designation as an “article” or “publication” may have been somewhat arbitrary.
4. Within each section, entries are listed alphabetically. Materials which might be especially useful are highlighted. If you feel other materials should be highlighted (or not), please contact Region III.
4. The Table of Contents has hot links to the sections of the bibliography. For example, if you are interested in “smart growth,” look under the “watershed approach” then press the control key and click on “smart growth” and you will be taken directly to that section of the bibliography.
