## **Current Progress at the Site**

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Delaware's Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) and EPA Region 3, are in the process of conducting initial site investigations. The facility has provided DNREC with their RCRA Facility Assessment (RFA) Report, which DNREC has approved. This report outlined all the areas of the site where waste was managed and areas of concern where material may have been spilled. Ametek also developed a RCRA Facility Investigation (RFI) work plan to specify where initial sampling would take place, which DNREC has approved. RFI sampling work has taken place in accordance with the RFI work plan. DNREC is currently waiting on a report of the results of the RFI sampling. Based on the results of that investigation additional sampling or corrective measures may be implemented as necessary to ensure protection of human health and the environment.

## **Site Description**

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The site is located at 900 Greenbank Road, New Castle County, Delaware. The property is bisected by Kirkwood Highway and is comprised of 32.41 acres. The area to the north of Kirkwood Highway is zoned residential while the land to the south is zoned primarily for industrial usage.

The site has functioned as a manufacturing facility from the late 1800's to 2004 when operation at the site ceased. The first known use for the site was as an iron works facility. Delaware Hard Fiber Company purchased the site in 1906 and manufactured vulcanized fiber products until 1933. The site was purchased by Haveg Industries in 1933 and was operated as a manufacturing facility for heat and corrosion resistant equipment. Haveg was acquired as a wholly owned subsidiary of Hercules in 1964. Ametek acquired the facility in 1980 where Teflon tubing was manufactured at the site until closure in 2004.

## **Site Responsibility**

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RCRA Corrective Action activities at this facility are being conducted under the direction of the Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) with assistance from EPA Region 3.

## Community Interaction

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This site has drawn interest from the surrounding community. DNREC responds to requests for information as they are received. Currently, DNREC's primary method of communicating with the community is thru regular interaction with the local civic association which has shown great interest in the outcome of this remediation.

## Institutional Controls

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There are currently no institutional controls in place at this time.
