Purpose	To promote the cleanup and reuse of brownfields, to provide financial assistance for brownfield revitalization, and to establish or enhance State and Tribal response programs. Brownfields are real properties, the expansion, redevelopment, or reuse of which may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant or contaminant as defined in Public Law 107-118					
Eligible Applicants	Local Governments, Land Clearance Authorities or similar quasi-governmental agencies under control of local government, Government entities created by State Legislatures, Regional Councils, Redevelopment Agencies chartered by the State, States and Federally-recognized Tribes * For Cleanup Grants only: Recipients must own the property to be cleaned up and may not be a responsible party for the contamination at the property. Eligible recipients for cleanup grants include nonprofit organizations in addition to the organizations identified above.
