

**K.A.R. 28-19-517 Class I Operating Permits; Annual Emission
Inventory**

(a) Each owner or operator of a stationary source that is required by these regulations to apply for a class I operating permit shall, on or before June 1 of each year, submit to the department all operating information and any other relevant information deemed necessary by the secretary to estimate the actual air emissions from the stationary source for the preceding year. If June 1 falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or holiday, then the submissions shall be due on or before the next business day following June 1. The timeliness of the submissions shall be determined by the postmark if submitted by mail.

(b) The information required by subsection (a) of this regulation shall be submitted on forms provided by the department or approved by the secretary. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-3005; implementing K.S.A. 65-3007; effective Jan. 23, 1995; amended Feb. 20, 1998; amended Sept. 23, 2005.)
