The site is located in Orange County, Florida, on State Route 441 west of Lake Fairview, outside the City of Orlando.

SETTING:

- The site and its surroundings to the north and east are zoned for commercial land uses.
- Areas to the south and west of the site are zoned for industrial land uses.
- Active land uses surrounding the site include two trailer parks, a window and door manufacturer, a commerce center, and a rail line.
- 400-acre Lake Fairview is located northeast of the site.
- Surrounding population: 0.5 mile, 1,292 people; 2.5 miles, 54,102 people; 4 miles, 165,624 people.
