A government official who hears and investigates complaints by private citizens against other officials or government agencies.

What is a Small Business?

EPA's Asbestos and Small Business Ombudsman (Asbo)

Purpose: Liaison between the Agency and Small Business Community. Designated official to respond to Asbestos complaints.

Mission: To improve the environmental and compliance performance of small businesses and EPA's consideration of small businesses.

Statutory Authorities:

1990 Clean Air Act Amendments (CAAA) Section 507(d)
Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA)
Small Business Paperwork Relief Act of 2002
Small Business Regulatory Enforcement Fairness Act (SBREFA)

Why do small businesses need a platform? Why do they need special attention? Shouldn't all businesses be regulated the same?

Responses

Not all business are regulated the same. Congress intended to level the playing field. Small businesses often face greater proportional burdens in their compliance efforts.

What Is EPA Doing to Consider Small Business Impacts?

Staffing the ASBO

Agency's commitment to ensure small businesses are considered and are not unreasonably burdened

Adhering to Statutory Requirements

- RFA as Amended by SBREFA
 - Consider impacts
 - Provide informal advice and guidance (Section 213)
 - ✓ Develop small entity compliance guides (Section 212)
 - Means to comment on the enforcement activity (section 222)
 - Rights of small entities during enforcement (Section 223)

What Is EPA Doing to Consider Small Business Impacts? (continued)

Honoring Agency Policy

- Assess impacts to small businesses (beyond statutory requirements)
- Help advise small business of their rights under the RFA/SBREFA
- Provide compliance information
- In certain cases, provide waivers or fine reduction (Audit Policy and Small Business Compliance Policy)

Cultivating Positive Impacts on the Quality of EPA Regulations

- Fill gaps in EPA's knowledge and experience to provide alternate less burdensome regulatory options
- EPA gains support for the regulatory option ultimately selected

- Why Should Small Business Connect with EPA's ASBO?
- Consistently rank regulatory issues among their highest concerns
- Cannot invest limited resources to hire attorneys/consultants
- Must meet obligations in all areas (land, air, water)
- Plain language is not exactly "plain"
- Rules seem "schizophrenic"
- Navigating the regulatory process

Regulatory:

- Ensure EPA programs consider small business impacts, <u>as actions</u> <u>are developed</u>:
 - Review monthly tiering actions;
 - Participate on workgroups;
 - Advise and answer questions about small business impacts;
 - Assist with the implementation of small entity outreach;
 - Participate on Small Business Advocacy Review (SBAR) Panels;
 - Coordinate program and small business consultation, when necessary; and
 - Distribute regulatory information.
