Milwaukee has implemented many climate actions by investing in infrastructure to manage stormwater runoff and received the 2011 Green CITTS program Leadership Award for an ongoing commitment to addressing stormwater impacts through green infrastructure. From 2003 to 2004, Milwaukee spent about \$900,000 on green infrastructure to absorb runoff and capture contaminants. The city installed downspout disconnections, rain barrels, and 60 rain-gardens to control runoff. These installations reduce the burden on inadequate storm-water infrastructure and prevent potential flood damage. Milwaukee also installed a twenty thousand square foot green roof on a local housing project and spent an additional \$300,000 on four other green roof projects.

Milwaukee has also managed its coastal vulnerabilities to climate change by partnering with The Conservation Fund (TCF), a national finance and land-acquisition nonprofit group, to help run its Greenseams program. This program has the goal of purchasing flood-prone, lowland properties in order to protect key areas from development and allow for natural stormwater filtration. By increasing natural filtration, the program lowers the amount of stormwater that reaches traditional infrastructure during
