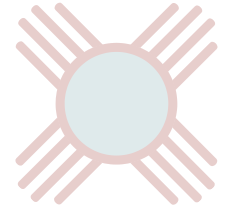


Introduction to Section 106 of the Clean Water Act (CWA): Grants for Water Pollution Control Programs
