AURORA, N.C. (June 3, 2009) ☐ Today, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers issued the Record of Decision and 404 wetlands permit necessary to allow PCS Phosphate ☐ Aurora to continue its mining operations.

☐ After more than eight years in this permitting process, we are obviously pleased with today's outcome, ☐ said Steve Beckel, general manager of the PCS Phosphate Aurora

facility. □ We would like to thank our employees, elected officials at all levels, as well as the community at-large, for their support in helping us reach this significant milestone. □

The final step in this 8+ year permitting process will be receiving the necessary state mining permits and certifications from the NC Department of Environment and Natural Resources. Once those permits are received, the company will have the necessary authorizations to allow it to continue its mining operations in Aurora.
