- 1. The parties enter into this Clean Air Act Mobile Source Expedited Settlement Agreement (Agreement) in order to settle the civil violations discovered as a result of the inspection specified in Table 1, attached, incorporated into this Agreement by reference. The civil violations that are the subject of this Agreement are described in Table 2, attached, incorporated into the Agreement by reference, regarding the vehicles/engines specified therein.
- Respondent admits being subject to the Clean Air Act (CAA) and its associated regulations and that
  the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has jurisdiction over the Respondent and
  the Respondent's conduct described in Table 2. Respondent does not contest the findings detailed
  therein, and waives any objections Respondent may have to EPA's jurisdiction.
- 3. Respondent consents to the payment of a penalty in the amount of \$5,100, further described in Table 3, attached, incorporated into the Agreement by reference. Respondent agrees to follow the instructions in "CAA Mobile Source Expedited Settlement Agreement Instructions," attached, incorporated into this Agreement by reference. Respondent certifies that the required remediation, detailed in Table 3, has been carried out.
- 4. By its first signature below, EPA approves the findings resulting from the inspection and alleged violations set forth in Table 1 and Table 2. Upon signing and returning this Expedited Settlement Agreement to EPA, Respondent consents to the terms of the Expedited Settlement without further notice. Respondent acknowledges that this Expedited Settlement Agreement is binding on the parties signing below, and becomes effective on the date of the EPA Air Enforcement Division Director's ratifying signature.

## Table 2 - Description of Violation and Vehicles/Engines

EPA has determined that the Utility Vehicles listed below (UTVs) were imported by Titan Imports, Inc. (Titan), and are not covered a certificate of conformity (COC) EPA found that the UTVs are not covered by the COC because the certificate application described vehicles having no adjustable parameters, while the imported UTVs have a carburetor needle jet with a clip, which is an adjustable parameter because changing the position of the clip would affect emissions. In addition, EPA determined that the manufacturer and model of the carburetor in the UTVs is different from the manufacturer and model of the carburetor described in the application for the COC. A COC covers only those vehicles that conform in all material respects to the design described in the application for the COC. Therefore, EPA finds that the vehicles are materially different from the certified design and, as a result, are not covered by the COC issued for engine family ATMTX.700A10. Thus, Titan has imported the UTVs in violation of 42 U.S.C. § 7522 (a) and 40 C.F.R. § 1068.101(a)(1).
