## **STORET and WQX Workshop for Tribal 106 and 319 Programs**

This workshop will provide participants with an overview of how STORET and WQX relates to local data management efforts, as well as provide hands on training on the tools used to submit data to the STORET system. In particular, participants will walk through what data elements are needed in a data submission, and receive instruction on how to use the WQX Web Excel data templates for various types of data (sonde or probe data, water chemistry data, biological or habitat data). There will also be opportunities for participants to use the WQX Web tool and get one on one questions answered. Participants are highly encouraged to bring their own laptops and data files with them to get the most out of this workshop. The workshop coordinators will not have laptops available for participant use.
