Re: Initial Attainment Status Recommendation for the Recently Revised Primary National Ambient Air Quality Standards for Sulfur Dioxide

Dear Mr. Blumenfeld:

The Pechanga Band of Luiseno Indians (Tribe) is pleased to provide the following comments regarding your March 29, 2011 letter related to the initial attainment status designations for the recently revised primary National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂). The Tribe appreciates the opportunity to provide information to assist the Environmental Protection Agency in this effort.

Background

The Pechanga Reservation covers approximately 6,700 acres in Southern Riverside County, CA and 119 acres in San Diego County, CA. Approximately 800 full-time residents live on the reservation. The reservation hosts 191 homes and 12 government buildings. Most of the reservation's current land use is rural residential. The Kelsey Tract section of the reservation hosts a hotel and casino, associated parking structures, a 160-acre golf course, a gas station, and an RV park.

Attainment Status Recommendation

The Tribe does not conduct ambient monitoring for SO₂ on the reservation. Therefore, in order to determine the appropriate attainment status for the reservation ambient air quality data from nearby monitoring stations was reviewed. This data from the nearby monitors is summarized and compared to the recently revised SO₂ NAAQS in Table 1 below.

As shown in Table 1 above, the maximum one-hour SO₂ concentration measured in the area surrounding the Reservation is well below the NAAQS. Based on this data, we believe that the Pechanga Indian Reservation should be classified as an attainment area for the primary SO₂ NAAQS.
