Directions and Parking

The closest metro stop is Union Station (red line). From the hotel, turn left onto New Jersey Avenue, then make a left onto E street at the first intersection. Take E Street to Columbus Circle. Union Station will be on your left.

Parking is limited at the Washington Court Hotel, so we recommend public transportation, biking, or ridesharing options. The valet parking at the hotel is \$36.00 daily. Overnight valet parking is \$46.00 per day. The hotel does not have a self-park garage.

Alternatively, the parking garage at the Liaison Hotel (415 New Jersey Ave, NW) charges \$14.00 daily if you park before 9:00 a.m. There is also a parking garage on F Street around the corner from the Washington Court that charges \$16.00 per day. Street parking may also be available, but please note and obey the posted street signs.

Restrooms

On the lower lobby level, restrooms are diagonal from the elevators. On the mezzanine level, restrooms are between the elevators and Montpelier room.

Food & Drink

Food and beverages will not be provided as part of the conference. Water pitchers and glasses will be provided. Coffee is available for purchase at the hostess stand at the hotel restaurant (\$3.25/cup). Within a 1-block radius of the hotel are Starbucks, Corner Bakery, and Café Phillips. In addition, there are a number of options at Union Station or in the surrounding blocks. The conference agenda includes a 1-hour lunch break. We suggest you explore the surrounding neighborhoods and popular lunch options, including Shake Shack, Roti Mediterranean Grill, Shophouse Asian Kitchen, and many others.
