The parties enter into this Clean Air Act Mobile Source Expedited Settlement Agreement (Agreement) in order to settle the civil violations discovered as a result of the inspection specified in Table 1, attached, incorporated into this Agreement by reference. The civil violations that are the subject of this Agreement are described in Table 2, attached, incorporated into the Agreement by reference, regarding the vehicles/engines specified therein.
- Respondent admits to being subject to the Clean Air Act (CAA) and its associated regulations and that
 the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has jurisdiction over the Respondent and
 the Respondent's conduct described in Table 2. Respondent does not contest the findings detailed
 therein, and waives any objections Respondent may have to the EPA's jurisdiction.
- 3. Respondent consents to the payment of a penalty in the amount of <u>\$5,000</u>, further described in Table 3. attached, incorporated into this Agreement by reference. Respondent agrees to follow the instructions in "CAA Mobile Source Expedited Settlement Agreement Instructions," attached, incorporated into this Agreement by reference. Respondent certifies that the required remediation, detailed in Table 3, has been carried out.
- 4. By its first signature below, the EPA approves the findings resulting from the inspection and alleged violations set forth in Table 1 and Table 2. Upon signing and returning this Agreement to the EPA. Respondent consents to the terms of this Agreement without further notice. Respondent acknowledges that this Agreement is binding on the parties signing below, and becomes effective on the date of the EPA Air Enforcement Division Director's ratifying signature.

The 500 gasoline generators imported by Stark International Inc. (Stark) on or about January 4, 2016 and described below (the Subject Generators) were found to be uncertified with respect to new, small nonroad spark-ignition equipment and engine standards under Title II of the Clean Air Act (CAA) due to the following issue: non-conforming catalysts from specifications in Certificate of Conformity (COC) for claimed engine family FFLTS.0635GA. Specifically, testing and analysis of the precious metal (PM) content of the sampled catalyst revealed that it is materially different from the certified design. Because a COC covers only equipment that is materially the same (including catalyst design, a key factor in emissions control) as those described in the COC application, the Subject Generators are not covered by a valid COC. The EPA has found no evidence that the Subject Generators are otherwise excluded from coverage. Specific violations are below. Thus, Stark has imported the Subject Generators in violation of CAA Sections 203(a)(1) and 213(d), 42 U.S.C. §§ 7522(a)(1) and 7547(d), and the regulations codified at 40 C.F.R. §§ 1068.101(a)(1) and (b)(5).
