ANNOUNCEMENT OF DRAFT PERMIT, OPPORTUNITY TO REQUEST A PUBLIC HEARING, AND REQUEST FOR PUBLIC COMMENT ON DRAFT CLEAN AIR ACT TITLE V PERMIT

Public Comment Period May 5, 2017 to June 5, 2017

Notice of Intent to Issue a Clean Air Act, Title V, Federal Operating Permit, United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Region 6, Multimedia Division.

Take notice that the United States Environmental Protection Agency has received an application for the initial operating permit for the following stationary source:

The Williams Four Corners, LLC – E & H Receiver located 30 miles south-southwest of Dulce, New Mexico. The mailing address is: Williams Four Corners, LLC, 1755 Arroyo Drive, Bloomfield, New Mexico 87413.

The Williams Four Corners, LLC – E & H Receiver is located on the Jicarilla Apache Reservation, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico. The source is a natural gas liquids receiver on a natural gas pipeline. The receiver collects liquids removed from the pipeline by pigging operations. compression and transmission facility with pressurized natural gas as its principal products. The primary pollutants emitted by the source are volatile organic compounds and hazardous air pollutants. This action proposes the following annual emission limits on the facility's potential to emit (PTE) on a ton per year (tpy) basis at the Williams Four Corners, LLC – E & H Receiver: 306.72 tpy of Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) and 6.35 tpy of Hazardous Air Pollutants (HAPs).

This source is required to obtain a Clean Air Act Title V Renewal Permit to Operate in accordance with Part 71 of Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). The permit will contain all the Clean Air Act requirements that apply to the source and is subject to the administrative requirements of 40 CFR § 71.11.

Public Comments and Public Hearing: If you have comments on the draft permit, you must submit them on or before June 5, 2017. You have the right to request a public hearing on the draft permit. Any request for a public hearing must be received by the EPA either by email or mail on or before June 2, 2017, and must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Attendance at the public hearing is not required in order to submit written comments. *If the EPA determines that there is significant public interest*, a public hearing will be held and a public notice will be posted thirty (30) day prior to the date of the hearing. If a public hearing is held, the public comment period shall automatically be extended to the close of the public hearing.

All comments received by June 5, 2017, and all comments made during a public hearing will be considered in arriving at a final decision on the permit. Additionally, all comments will be included in the administrative record without change, and may be made available to the public, including any personal information provided, unless the comment includes Confidential Business Information (CBI) or other information whose disclosure is restricted by statute. Thus, CBI or other protected information should be clearly identified as such, and should not be submitted through email.

Emails sent directly to the EPA will capture your email address automatically and will be included as a part of the public comment. Please note that an email or postal address must be provided with your comments if you wish to receive a statement of reasons for changes made to the draft permit and responses to comments submitted during the public comment period.

If you believe any condition of the draft permit is inappropriate or that our initial decision to deny an application, terminate a permit, or prepare a draft permit is inappropriate, you must raise all reasonably ascertainable issues and submit all reasonably ascertainable arguments supporting your position by the close of the public comment period. Any supporting materials that you submit must be included in full and may not be incorporated by reference, unless they are already part of the administrative record for this permit proceeding or consist of State, tribal, or Federal statutes and regulations, EPA documents of general availability, or other generally available reference materials.
