

Special Conditions

- 3. This RACT Permit is for the operation of the various Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC's) sources (Dip Line, Lamination Line, Ross Line, Glue Tables, Urethane Line, Boiler #1, Boiler #2, and Box Dryers) used at Chestnut Ridge Foam, Inc. located in East Huntingdon Twp., Westmoreland County.
- Chestnut's emissions shall not exceed 165.57 tons per year of VOC's at their facility in Latrobe.
- Records shall be retained for at least two years and shall be made available to the department upon request.
- 8. Chestnut shall continue to officially document and maintain monthly records on the quantity of VOC containing compounds used at the facility.
