Johnstown America Corp. Freight Car Division - Franklin Plant RACT Operating Permit No. 11 - 000 - 288

- This RACT Operating Permit is for the approval of the RACT Plan as submitted by Johnstown America for the continued operation of the Franklin Plant -Freight Car Division located in West Taylor Township, Cambria County.
- The facility is to be operated in accordance with the RACT plan submitted as approved herein.
- 5. Johnstown America shall keep a daily record of the quantity of all coatings and cleaning solvents used at each spray booth. At a minimum, the record shall contain the gallons of each coating and solvent used, the coating density before and after the use of diluents, the gallons of diluents used and the density of the diluents, the gallons of water contained in the coating and the weight percent of organic volatiles in the coating and/or solvents.
- Johnstown America shall maintain the above records for all coatings and cleaning solvents in stock or shipped off-site for disposal for a period of not less than two years and be made available to the Department upon request.
- Johnstown America shall develop and submit a solvent management strategy to the Department within six (6) months of receipt of this operating permit.
- Johnstown America shall submit an annual report with the AIMS emissions statement, to include; the total amount of coatings applied and the VOC content of each coating applied for the previous year's operation.
- Johnstown America Corp. shall install, maintain and operate all heat treating furnaces in accordance within the manufacturers specifications.

10. Johnstown America Corp. shall maintain records in accordance with the recordkeeping requirements of 25 Pa Code Ch. 129.95. The records shall provide sufficient data and calculations to clearly demonstrate that the requirements of 25 Pa Code Ch. 129.91-94 are met and to verify compliance with requirements of this RACT permit. Data and information required to determine compliance shall be recorded and maintained in a time frame consistent with averaging periods to verify compliance. These Records shall be retained for at least 2 years and shall be made available to the Department on request.
