 - a. operated in such a manner as not to cause air pollution;
 - in compliance with the specifications and conditions of the applicable plan approval(s) issued;
 - c. operated and maintained in a manner consistent with good operating and maintenance practices.
- 2. This permit is valid only for the specific equipment, location and owner named above.

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- This operating permit incorporates Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT) determinations as required by Title 1 provisions of the Clean Air Act Amendments and 25 Pa. Code Sections 129.91 through 129.95 for the following natural gas-fired sources:
 - 2 Natco 13.8 million BTU/hour heaters (Heaters A and B)
 - 2 Applied Thermal model 32-5A 4.75 million BTU/hour heaters
 - 1 Cyclotherm model C4400LN4B 5.0 million BTU/hour boiler
 - 1 Ingersoll Rand PSVG8 544 horsepower emergency standby generator

This operating permit supersedes operating permit 53-302-008 and includes conditions previously contained in operating permit 53-302-008.

- 5. Pursuant to Section 129.93(c) of Chapter 129 of Article III of the Rules and Regulations of the Department of Environmental Protection, the 4 heaters and the boiler identified in condition 3 herein shall be maintained and operated in accordance with manufacturer's specifications. They shall additionally be maintained and operated in accordance with good air pollution control practices. Compliance with these conditions shall also be considered as RACT for the volatile organic compound emissions from the respective heaters and boiler.
- Pursuant to Section 129.93(c) of Chapter 129 of Article III of the Rules and Regulations of the Department of Environmental Protection, the Ingersoll Rand PSVG8 emergency standby generator shall not be operated for 500 or more hours in any consecutive 12 month period. Additionally, it shall be maintained and operated in accordance with manufacturer's specifications and good air pollution control practices. Compliance with these conditions shall also be considered as RACT for the volatile organic compound emissions from the respective generator.
 - 7. The company shall maintain comprehensive accurate records in accordance with Section 129.95 of Chapter 129 of Article III of the Rules and Regulations of the Department of Environmental Protection. At an absolute minimum, these records are to include the information required pursuant to condition 10 herein as well as the number of hours per month

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that the Ingersoll Rand PSVG8 emergency standby generator is operated. All records maintained pursuant to Section 129.95 shall be retained for a minimum of 2 years and shall be made available to the Department upon request.

- Only pipeline quality natural gas is to be used as fuel in the Natco heaters as well as the rest of the sources identified in condition 3 herein.
- 10. The company shall maintain comprehensive accurate records (number of hours) of Natco heater operation per year and shall make the information available to the Department upon request.
