The 44 highway motorcycles described below were found to be imported by CRT Motor, Inc. in violation of Section 203(a)1) of the Clean Air Act (CAA), 42 U.S.C. § 7522(a)(1), and the regulations codified at 40 C.F.R. §§ 86.407-78(a), 1068.101(a)(1), and 1068.101(b)(5), which collectively prohibit the importation of engines or equipment containing these engines, unless they are covered by a valid EPA certificate of conformity (COC) or are properly exempted or excluded. The EPA took the muffler/exhaust assembly from the inspected highway motorcycle and sent it to an EPA laboratory for analysis. Physical and chemical examination of the muffler assembly of the exhaust system revealed the design of the catalyst contained material significantly different from the catalyst design specified in the COC application for the engine family. Specifically, the ratio of precious metals in the tested sample differs significantly from the certified design. The EPA found no evidence that the highway motorcycles are excluded from coverage. Hence, the 44 highway motorcycles are uncertified, and they cannot legally be imported into the United States.
