Dear Mr. Steinwurtzel:

This letter is in response to your Request for Correction (RFC), on behalf of the Association of Battery Recyclers (ABR), dated October 14, 2008, pursuant to the *Guidelines for Ensuring and Maximizing the Quality, Objectivity, Utility, and Integrity of Information Disseminated by the Environmental Protection Agency* (EPA IQG)¹. Your request cites concerns about the objectivity and utility of a scientific document that was part of the evidence relied upon by EPA in support of the proposed and final rulemaking on the National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for lead (73 FR 29184, 73 FR 66964). The final rule was signed by the Administrator on October 15, 2008, and the *Responses to Significant Comments on the 2008 Proposed Rule on the National Ambient Air Quality Standards for Lead* (Response to Comments) document was also completed and submitted to the rulemaking docket² on that day.

The lead NAAQS Rule that is the subject of your IQG request has been challenged in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit. The ABR is a petitioner challenging this rule. Since the issues raised in your RFC may be related to the on-going litigation, EPA is deferring consideration of your request at this time.

However, if at the conclusion of the litigation your data quality concerns have not been addressed, you may resubmit this request. If you choose to submit an RFC within 90 days of the conclusion of the litigation, please send your written request to the EPA Information Quality Guidelines Processing Staff via mail (Information Quality Guidelines Processing Staff, Mail Code 2811R, U.S. EPA, 1200 Pennsylvania Ave. NW, Washington, D.C. 20460); or fax (202-565-2441).
