





1. Are schools required to follow EPA's Indoor Air Quality Tools for Schools guidance?

Using guidance such as the <u>IAQ Tools for Schools</u> guidance is completely voluntary. EPA does not require the retention or submission of any IAQ assessment information gathered. However, some states have recently enacted legislation








Step 2—Input User Information

At the beginning of each checklist, you will be prompted to fill in your—



- Classroom name/location








