

SQG RE-NOTIFICATION REQUIRED IN 2021

As the treatment, storage, or disposal facility (TSDF) helping manage your hazardous waste, we want to ensure our customers are aware of recent regulatory changes that impact small businesses. Under U.S. EPA's Hazardous Waste Generator Improvements Rule, small quantity generators (SQGs) are now required to re-notify every four years. To satisfy this requirement, SQGs need to update their Notification of RCRA Subtitle C Activities (Site Identification Form), also known as EPA Form 8700-12, or state equivalent* by

September 1, 2021
