<u>can</u> fund development of<u>Wetland</u> Water Quality Standards(WQS)













Why Develop Wetland Water Quality Standards?



 To ensure that wetlands or specific wetland types are protected for their designated uses.













Wetland Water Quality Standards

- How are Wetland WQS developed?
- Identify and define specific wetland types
- identify specific designated uses for those wetland types
- identify specific narrative or numeric standards for those wetlands.










What's in a Wetland Program?



EPA says a Wetland Program

has 4 Core Elements:

- 1. Regulation
- 2. Monitoring and Assessment
- 3. Voluntary Restoration and Protection
- 4. Wetland Water Quality Standards













What Wetland WQS Actions are Fundable?

EPA identified fundable actions for each Core Element in:

Wetland Program Development Grants - Eligible Activities

The WPDG funds are

for program development

and

for program refinement.

but

not for day-to-day program

implementation.















What Wetland WQS Actions are Fundable?

Fundable actions include:

- Define wetlands:
 - Adopt a definition of wetlands
 - Include the wetland definition in water quality standards description
- Develop approach to develop WQS:
 - Gather and analyze wetlands data
 - Define and adopt wetland designated uses to be achieved and protected
 - Establish narrative and/or numeric WQS
 - Define antidegradation policies
- Refine approach:
 - Incorporate Wetland WQS into decision processes like 401 certification and mitigation requirements
 - Incorporate Wetland WQS into restoration-effectiveness tracking
 - Incorporate Wetland WQS into monitoring and assessment

A bit more background on...

Wetland Program Development Grants

- Competitive Grants
- Timing:
 - Past: Tribes-Only National Request for Applications
 - Request for proposals was issued Nov 2, 2020
 - Proposals were due January 15, 2021.
 - Next round anticipated in less than 2 years.
 - Most recent National RFA for Tribes: FY 21-22 RFA for WPDG
 - Future: Region 9 Request for Applications for Tribes, States, and local governments out in Spring or Summer


State Revolving Fund

State Revolving Fund

From: US EPA & States



<u>Example</u>: In 2010 Yurok received an SRF 0% interest loan from CA to purchase 22,237 ac, including some clear-cut land.

Purchase allowed Yurok to implement BMPs and reduce NPS pollution on their lands and in State waters downstream.

Example of Other Funding

National Coastal Resilience Fund



From: National Fish and Wildlife Foundation

<u>Focus</u>: Improving the resilience of coastal ecosystems and communities.

Supports projects that restore and strengthen natural systems that protect coastal communities from flooding while enhancing fish and wildlife habitats.

Congress appropriated \$34 million to fund projects

Pre-proposals due on April 7, 2021.

Tribal Climate Resilience Program

From: BIA

Focus: for Tribal activities that support:

- Tribal climate adaptation and resilience planning,
- Ocean and coastal management planning, and
- Relocation, managed retreat, or protect-in-place planning and design activities for coastal and riverine communities.

Proposals due Friday, April 23, 2021.



Other Funding

Building Resilient Infrastructure & Communities (BRIC)

From: FEMA

Focus: Pre-disaster mitigation planning.

A new annual FEMA grant program to encourage disaster mitigation activities including using nature-based solutions for strengthening resilience.

NOFO Opened 9/30/20 and closed 1/29/21.

- This past year each tribe got about \$600K set aside to apply for.
- Half of that could go to planning, like developing a THMP.
- After \$600K, can compete for more.










