Read about the <u>EPA's plans for a local job readiness program</u> at the Yerington/Anaconda mine that will support the Yerington Paiute Tribe's efforts to establish a job training program.

On October 19th, a <u>US Senate oversight hearing</u> on the EPA Brownfields Program focused on cleanup and redevelopment accomplishments of the Brownfields Program to date. Aaron Scheff, the Idaho Department of Natural Resources Brownfields Program Manager, testified at the hearing and provided a rural perspective. Scheff said "the brownfields program has enjoyed great successes in Idaho and has generated many fans, especially in our rural communities where trust in and acceptance of government programs and regulations is difficult to earn." <u>Read Aaron Scheff's full testimony</u>.
