Chemical Identity Requirements

For each chemical reported in a PMN or Bona Fide submission, the following are required:

- Correct CA Index or Preferred Name for TSCA purposes
- CAS Registry Number (if one is available for that name)
- Complete chemical structure for a Class 1 substance and representative or partial structure(s) for a Class 2 substance
- Molecular Formula (where applicable)
- List of reactants and brief description of reaction or process for manufacturing Class 2 substance
- For polymers, all information requested according to Page 5 of EPA's PMN Form

Methods for Acquiring CAS Nomenclature

Method 1:

- Use CAS Inventory Expert Service and submit CAS results to EPA
- EPA will accept the CAS results provided that there are no changes made after CAS assigned the name and there are no inconsistencies in the notice

Method 2:

- Use any other source or service bureau
- If EPA has a problem with the CAS name, CAS number, chemical formula, or process description submitted, the submitter must correct the problem before PMN review can proceed

Importing a Confidential Chemical Substance

You must request your foreign supplier to comply with the chemical identity and CAS nomenclature requirements and send the information to EPA on your behalf Substances Involving a Confidential Trade Mark Reactant

 CAS nomenclature is not required for a chemical substance made from a confidential trademark reactant not specifically identified to the submitter • Submitter must still ensure that the trade mark reactant supplier provides the necessary chemical identity information directly to EPA on the submitter's behalf
