1. Sustainability Tracking, Assessment & Rating System (STARS)

"A transparent, self-reporting framework for colleges and universities to measure their sustainability performance." ⁱⁱ This tool allocates various numbers of points in the form of "credits" for many different product and service categories, spanning environmental, social and economic sustainability topics. An institution's STARS score is based on the percentage of applicable points it earns across four categories: academics, engagement, operations and planning & administration. Several of these credits contain purchasing-related requirements, summarized below.

4. Observations

The STARS rating system and guidance documents are primarily focused on US higher education institutions and are widely adopted in that sector. Universities' environmental impacts are directly connected to the purchase, use and disposal of goods and services. The purchasing related guidance provided is comprehensive, covers multiple environmental, social and economic impact categories, and refers to many other standards and programs. The credit system is similar to the U.S. Green Building Council's (USGBC) Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) system in providing guidance, providing recognition for leadership but also enabling some flexibility in how they are applied by different organizations. While designed for Universities, the guidance provided may be applicable to other institutional settings.
