

Check	Activity
	Determine and document the need for a project to mitigate future damage or address rebuilding of drinking water utility after a disaster. Necessary project information should include, but is not limited to, a description of existing water facilities, facility needs, the nature of the project being considered, and project cost estimates. Approach the respective State SRF agency about the possibility of funding the project. Ask if the State has set-aside funds to potentially fund technical assistance to address disaster mitigation or a recovery/rebuilding project.
	Complete and submit to State SRF the initial project paperwork to simply express interest in SRF funding. This paperwork can be found on State SRF websites or received through State contacts.
	If your project is chosen for funding, formulate details of the project and complete any additional applications with assistance of State SRF agency.
	Begin project.
	Manage work and costs.
	Cooperate with progress reporting and oversight requirements as directed by the State.
	Close out project.
	Cooperate with audits of your program and financial records by government officials.
