Subject: Addendum to Application for General Air Quality Permit

Mr. Rios:

Fisher Sand & Gravel – New Mexico, Inc. (Fisher) would like to add this letter as an addendum to its June 2015 application for coverage under the general air quality permit for new or modified minor source stone quarrying, crushing, and screening facilities in Indian country. The facility, Grey Mesa Gravel Pit, will be a portable stone quarrying, crushing, and screening facility located at an abandoned gravel pit. In the application, the June 2009 Archaeological Inventory Report and the Cultural Resources Compliance Form noted the following three conditions:

- 1) No widening of the existing haul road be undertaken in the vicinity of the three historic sites indicated in the June 2009 Archaeological Inventory Report.
- 2) All construction within 50ft of the boundaries of sites NM-G-46-76 and NM-G-46-77 (boundaries shown in Figures 5 & 6 of the June 2009 Archaeological Inventory Report) must be flagged and monitored by a qualified archaeologist prior to any activity.
- 3) In the event of a discovery [“discovery” means any previously unidentified or incorrectly identified cultural resources including but not limited to archaeological deposits, human remains, or locations reportedly associated with Native American religious/traditional beliefs or practices], all operations in the immediate vicinity of the discovery must cease, and the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department must be notified at (928) 871-7198.
