

Liz Lyons, Privacy Officer for the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) of Washington D.C. As privacy officer Liz focuses on technology the MPD deploys for law enforcement needs such as body cameras and CCTV. The MPD is the first police department in the nation to employ a privacy officer. During law school Liz worked as a legal intern at the Electronic Frontier Foundation and spent a summer studying the UN-backed Cambodia war crimes tribunal.
