

Charge for MSTRS Ports Initiative Workgroup


EPA asked for recommendations on:

- How to effectively measure air quality and GHG performance of ports and/or terminals within ports.
- Design elements for an EPA lead voluntary program to improve environmental performance as goods move through ports.
 - Begin with air quality and climate improvements
 - Include requirements for meaningful engagement between the port communities and the ports
 - Explore opportunities to address other environmental media

The current concept is an “open resource” initiative rather than a membership program.

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- **Information and tool resources:**
 - Standardized methodologies and metrics and guidance -- clear and accessible.
 - A well-designed web portal to access a variety of tools and information.
 - Clearinghouse on technologies, verification and barriers to technology implementation.
 - Ombudsman function for assistance and expertise
- **Funding sources are vital to accelerating future progress.**
 - DERA should be reauthorized, sustainable and fully funded.
 - Add a planning / seed grant option.
 - Coordination of funding from a variety of agencies
 - Sustainable funding source
- **Port community and stakeholder resources, materials and best practices in port community outreach and communications.**
 - Ports 101; EJ 101; Toolbox in draft form fall 2015
- **Connect to and be a resource for other programs**

Next Steps

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- Working on gaps:
