The Office of Inspector General (OIG) for the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) plans to begin fieldwork on EPA's oversight of disaster debris management in June 2015. This project is included in our fiscal year 2015 annual plan.

The OIG's objective is to determine whether the EPA Office of Solid Waste and Emergency Response (OSWER) has worked with appropriate federal agencies and verified that states have planned for disaster debris management. The OIG plans to conduct work at OSWER and selected EPA regions and authorized states. Applicable generally accepted government auditing standards will be used in conducting our project. The anticipated benefits of this project are reduced human exposure and environmental contamination, reduced potential Superfund liability and cleanup costs, and enhanced planning for the potential effects of climate change.

We will contact you to arrange a mutually agreeable time to discuss our objectives and the purpose of the fieldwork phase of our project. We would also be particularly interested in any areas of concern that you may have. We will answer any of your questions about the project process, reporting procedures, methods used to gather and analyze data, and what we should expect of each other during the course of the project. Throughout the project, we will provide email updates to agreed-upon contacts on a regular basis

We respectfully note that the OIG is authorized by the Inspector General Act of 1978 to have timely access to personnel and all materials necessary to complete its objectives. We will request your resolution if an agency employee or contractor refuses to provide requested records to the OIG, or otherwise fails to cooperate with the OIG. We may report unresolved access matters to the Administrator and include the incident in the Semiannual Report to Congress.
