Dear Ms. Bunte:

The City of Shreveport would like to participate in Ozone Advance with respect to the Shreveport-Bossier City Metropolitan Statistical Area. We have received confirmation from officials representing the other principal governing bodies within this MSA (City of Bossier City, Caddo Parish Commission, Bossier Parish Police Jury and DeSoto Parish Police Jury) that they would like to participate with us in this effort, and have received the same confirmation from the local metropolitan planning organization (Northwest Louisiana Council of Governments). We have also received support for our participation from the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality (LDEQ). We wish to join this partnership with EPA to preserve or improve the air quality in the Shreveport-Bossier City MSA, and we meet the program eligibility criteria, i.e.:

- (1) The Shreveport-Bossier City MSA is not currently a nonattainment area for either the 1997 8-hour or the 2008 ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS),
- (2) The Shreveport-Bossier City MSA consists of Caddo, Bossier and DeSoto Parishes in northwest Louisiana.
- (3) The following air monitor(s) reflect the air quality in this MSA:  
  
220170001 – Dixie Site  
220150008 – Downtown Shreveport Airport Site
- (4) The LDEQ continues to input required emission inventory information into the National Emissions Inventory System for all relevant point sources within the boundaries of our MSA.



We understand that our efforts under Ozone Advance may benefit the Shreveport – Bossier City MSA by potentially:

- Reducing air pollution in terms of ozone as well as other air pollutants,
- Ensuring continued healthy ozone levels,
- Maintaining the ozone NAAQ
- Helping avoid violations of the ozone NAAQS that could lead to a future nonattainment designation,
- Increasing public awareness about ground-level ozone as an air pollutant, and
- Targeting limited resources toward actions to address ozone problems quickly.

Our goal is to implement measures and programs to reduce ozone in the Shreveport – Bossier City MSA in the near term. We agree to that it is in our best interest to work together and in coordination with stakeholders and the public to proactively pursue this goal.
