

RECs and Environmental Claims

- REC ownership allows you to claim that you are using renewable electricity
 - Once a claim is made, the RECs are retired
- REC ownership signifies that your electricity was generated by a zero emissions resource
- REC ownership does not represent a direct emissions reduction or an avoided emission claim
- Substantiation of your claims is necessary
 - FTC's Green Guides and the National Association of Attorneys General Guidance
