Tennessee Amended Nonattainment Area Recommendation for Lead

Dear Mr. Meiburg:

On October 16, 2009, Tennessee made a recommendation for a lead nonattainment boundary in Sullivan County, Tennessee. A copy of this letter is enclosed for ease of reference.

In discussions with EPA Region IV air staff and upon execution of ambient air quality modeling, the state of Tennessee desires to modify its original recommendation to now be as follows:

Sullivan County (partial)

The area encompassed by a 1.25 km radius circle centered on Universal Transverse Mercator (UTM) coordinate 4042904.5 N and 386274.5 E (Zone 17).

The area recommended encompasses a stationary point source that manufactures lead acid storage batteries. There are no other notable sources of lead in the county. For ease of reference, a graphic of the revised recommended nonattainment boundary is enclosed.

All remaining areas of Tennessee not specified above are recommended as attainment or unclassifiable for the lead NAAQS.

I believe this amended recommendation will continue to enable Tennessee to attain the lead standard within the deadlines established by the Clean Air Act and its implementation regulations.

Dear Mr. Meiburg:

As the Commissioner of the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation, I am designated to file the recommended lead attainment designations for Tennessee as required by the Clean Air Act. The designation recommendations are based on the lead monitoring data for 2005-2007 as provided by EPA. EPA has not yet provided a design value calculation tool in the AQS System to run reports for the most recent data or verify the data used by EPA. As such, Tennessee reserves the right to change our recommendation when EPA makes these tools available.

The following area is recommended as nonattainment for the revised lead national ambient air quality standard (NAAQS):

Sullivan County (partial)

The area encompassed by a circle centered on Universal Transverse Mercator (UTM) coordinate 4042923 Meters E, 386267 Meters N (Zone 17) with a radius of 1.0 kilometers.

The area recommended encompasses a stationary point source that manufactures lead acid storage batteries. There are no other notable sources of lead in the county.




