

Request for Comments on Candidates for the Chemical Safety Advisory Committee (CSAC) Subcommittee Reviewing the Draft Risk Assessment for 1-Bromopropane:

CSAC subcommittee members assist in reviews conducted by the 10 members of the CSAC. The subcommittee members provide additional scientific expertise to augment the knowledge base of the chartered committee.

In the March 16, 2016 *Federal Register* (81FR14111), EPA requested nominations for the May 2016 meeting of the CSAC to consider and review the draft risk assessment for TSCA work plan chemical, 1-bromopropane (CASRN-106-94-5). Individuals nominated for this meeting should have expertise in one or more of the following areas: Epidemiology of neurotoxicity of volatile and semivolatile organic chemicals; risk assessment of neurotoxic chemicals; risk assessment for developmental toxicity of volatile and semivolatile organic chemicals; cancer assessment of mutagenic chemicals; statistics with experience with bench mark dose response analysis of cancer and noncancer endpoints; occupational exposure to volatile and semivolatile organic chemicals; consumer exposure to volatile and semivolatile organic chemicals. For the May 2016 meeting, EPA anticipates selecting 3 to 4 subcommittee members to augment the expertise of the CSAC chartered committee.
