EPA Region 6 Announces the Proposed Plan
and Public Comment Period for the
San Jacinto River Waste Pits Superfund Site
September 2016



The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), in cooperation with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ), announces a Public Comment Period and public meeting regarding the proposed cleanup strategy for the San Jacinto River Waste Pits Superfund Site in Harris County, Texas. The EPA's preferred remedy will address dioxin and furan contamination in a set of impoundments impacted by liquid pulp and paper mill wastes disposed in the impoundments.

A public meeting to inform residents of the proposed cleanup strategy and obtain comments on the Proposed Plan and EPA's preferred remedy will be held at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, October 20, 2016, at the Highlands Community Center, 604 Highland Woods Drive, Highlands, Texas.
