The Office of Inspector General (OIG) for the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) plans to begin field work to determine whether EPA Region 4 and the state of North Carolina followed appropriate procedures in addressing claims of an improper asbestos demolition at the Old Davis Hospital in Statesville, North Carolina. This project is included in the OIG's Annual Plan for fiscal year 2017.

The OIG plans to conduct work at Region 4. We may also contact other EPA, state, or local offices, to be determined later. To conduct our work, we are requesting that Region 4 identify its points of contact for this review. Applicable generally accepted government auditing standards will be used in conducting our project. The anticipated benefits of this project are improvements in the protection of human health from asbestos exposure that can cause mesothelioma, lung cancer and asbestosis.

We will contact you to arrange a mutually agreeable time to discuss our objectives and the purpose of our project. We would also be particularly interested in any areas of concern that you may have. We will answer any of your questions about the project process, reporting procedures, methods used to gather and analyze data, and what we should expect of each other during the course of the project. Throughout the project, we will provide updates on a regular basis.

We respectfully note that the OIG is authorized by the Inspector General Act of 1978 to have timely access to personnel and all materials necessary to complete its objectives. We will request your resolution if an agency employee or contractor refuses to provide requested records to the OIG, or otherwise fails to cooperate with the OIG. We may report unresolved access matters to the Administrator and include the incident in the Semiannual Report to Congress.
