DATE OF THIS NOTICE: June 8, 2017

PURPOSE OF THIS NOTICE: The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is announcing its proposed decision that Corrective Action is Complete with Controls under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, as amended (RCRA) for the Akzo Nobel, Incorporated Facility (Facility).

FACILITY DESCRIPTION: The Facility is owned by Akzo Nobel, Incorporated and is located at 385 Schoolhouse Road, Delaware City, DE. The Facility produced carbon disulfide and NaHS until operations ceased in 1992. The Facility is 191-acres, with 68-acres comprising the Study area where the proposed final remedy for Corrective Action is focused.

COMMENT PROCESS: Persons wishing to comment on EPA's proposed decision must submit comments to EPA within the 30-day comment period ending July 7, 2017. Interested persons may also request a public hearing on this proposed remedy. All comments and/or requests for a hearing must be submitted in writing via mail, fax, or email to the EPA Project Manager, Barbara Smith, as listed above, and must be received by July 7, 2017. All comments will be considered in making a final decision.

FINAL DECISION: EPA will make a final decision after considering all comments, consistent with applicable RCRA requirements and regulations. If the decision is substantially unchanged from the one in this notice, EPA will issue a final decision and inform all persons who submitted written comments or requested notice of EPA's final determination. If the final decision is significantly different from the one proposed, EPA will issue a public notice explaining the new decision and will reopen the comment period.
