AMENDED  
ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

I.

At all times alleged herein, the Respondent, Gould, Inc., 555 Farnam Street, Omaha, Nebraska 68102, is and was a Delaware corporation, which operated a secondary lead refinery in Omaha, Nebraska, and whose resident agent for service of process is and was C.T. Corporation, 206 South 13th Street, Lincoln, Nebraska 68508, and the Department of Environmental Control is and was the agency of the State of Nebraska charged with the duty, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 81-1504(1) (Reissue 1981), as amended, of exercising exclusive general jurisdiction of the administration and enforcement of the provisions of Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 81-1501 through 81-1533 (Reissue 1981), as amended, and all rules, regulations and orders duly promulgated thereunder.

II.


George H. Ludwig, Acting Director of the Department of Environmental Control, acting within the scope of his authority pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 81-1507 (Reissue 1981), as amended, enters the following Order on November 9<sup>th</sup>, 1983:

"Respondent is located in an area that has exceeded the National Ambient Air Quality Standard for lead and part of

the State Implementation Plan control strategy includes the plant being closed, which it is;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Respondent notify the Department at least 60 days prior to resuming operations at this facility and obtain a permit to operate prior to start-up. A permit to resume operation of this plant will be issued only if it is determined that such operation will not cause or contribute to violation of the lead standard; such determination to be made on the basis of calculated lead emissions from the facility and the resulting impact on air quality in the vicinity, using methods of estimating or measuring emissions and air quality models deemed appropriate by the Department. The permit will be issued in accordance with Neb. Rev. Stat. § 81-1504(20) (Supp. 1983).
