PURPOSE OF THIS NOTICE: The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is announcing its proposed decision that no corrective action is necessary under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, as amended (RCRA), for the Jamestown Powder Coatings facility (Facility).

FACILITY DESCRIPTION: The Facility is located at 710 Beaver Road, Girard, PA. Jamestown manufactures industrial paint coatings. All industrial activity and storage of hazardous materials were done inside the buildings. Investigations were completed, and no hazardous constituents were found above EPA's Regional Screening Level risk range.

COMMENT PROCESS: Persons to comment on EPA's proposed decision must submit comments to EPA within the 30-day comment period ending **Friday**, **January 04**, **2019**. Interested persons may also request a public hearing on this proposed remedy. All comments and/or requests for a hearing must be submitted in writing via mail, fax, or email to the EPA Project Manager, Linda Matyskiela, as listed above, and must be received prior to **Friday**, **January 04**, **2019**. All comments will be considered in making a final decision.

FINAL DECISION: EPA will make a final decision after considering all comments, consistent with applicable RCRA requirements and regulations. If the remedy is substantially unchanged from the one in this notice, EPA will issue a final decision and inform all persons who submitted written comments or requested notice of EPA's final determination. If the remedy is significantly different from the one proposed, EPA will issue a public notice explaining the new remedy and will reopen the comment period.
