

## **Public Notice: PMC Polymer Products Facility - Stockertown, PA**

**DATE OF THIS NOTICE: 12/17/2018**

**PURPOSE OF THIS NOTICE:** The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) announces its proposed decision that no further investigation or cleanup is required at this time, under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, as amended (RCRA), for the PMC Polymer Product Inc. (facility).

**FACILITY DESCRIPTION:** The facility currently specializes in the design, development, and production of plastic additive master-batches and flame retardant compounds. It is located at 100 Station Avenue, Stockertown, PA 18083. The facility occupies an 11-acre parcel within Stockertown. Based upon information referenced in the Administrative Record, sampling of soil and groundwater indicate concentrations below corresponding Pennsylvania human health standards. At this facility, protection of human health and the environment have been achieved.

**COMMENT PROCESS:** Persons to comment on EPA's proposed decision must submit comments to EPA within the 30-day comment period ending **Wednesday, January 16, 2019**. Interested persons may also request a public hearing on this proposed remedy. All comments and/or requests for a hearing must be submitted in writing via mail, fax, or email to the EPA Project Manager, Grant Dufficy, as listed above, and must be received prior to **Wednesday, January 16, 2019**. All comments will be considered in making a final decision.

**FINAL DECISION:** EPA will make a final decision after considering all comments, consistent with applicable RCRA requirements and regulations. If the remedy is substantially unchanged from the one in this notice, EPA will issue a final decision and inform all persons who submitted written comments or requested notice of EPA's final determination. If the remedy is significantly different from the one proposed, EPA will issue a public notice explaining the new remedy and will reopen the comment period.
