FACT SHEET

Revisions to Test Methods, Performance Specifications, and Testing Regulations

ACTION

- On August 14, 2015, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency proposed routine corrections and updates to some of the air pollution measurement methods that are included in various stationary source regulations and used at stationary and industrial sources.
- The proposed revisions consist primarily of typographical errors, technical errors in equations and diagrams, updates to procedures, and the addition of alternative methods that the Agency has deemed acceptable to use. The proposed revisions apply to industries that are already subject to various provisions.
- The proposed revisions improve the quality of data and give source testers the flexibility to use newly approved alternative procedures.
- Many of the proposed revisions were brought to EPA's attention by regulated sources and end-users like environmental consultants and compliance professionals.
- EPA takes this routine step every few years to improve consistency in measurement methods and data quality.
