

Background - EPA American Iron & Steel

- The "American Iron and Steel" provision requires SRF loan recipients to use iron and steel products that are produced in the United States for the construction, alteration, maintenance, or repair of a public water system or treatment works (Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2014 P.L. 113-76).
- Water Resources Reform and Development Act made
 AIS permanent for CWSRF June 10, 2014.
- America's Water Infrastructure Act 2018 extended the AIS requirements for DWSRF projects through September 30, 2023 on October 23, 2018.



Background - USDA RD American Iron & Steel

- AIS requirements effective since May 5, 2017.
- Section 746 Division A Title VII of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2017: Requires iron and steel products used in projects funded by USDA RD programs to be produced in the United States.
- USDA RUS Bulletin 1780-35, RD-GD-2017-88: Instructs and informs RD State Office staff and others on how to implement USDA RD AIS requirements to ensure compliance.

What Projects are Covered by AIS?



EPA

- All treatment works projects funded by a <u>CWSRF</u> assistance agreement
- All public water system projects funded by a <u>DWSRF</u> assistance agreement
- Phased projects:
 - Multi-phased projects are considered a single project if they are closely related in purpose, place and time.

USDA RD

- Projects with obligated funds from:
 - Water and Waste Disposal Loan and Grant program
 - Guaranteed Loan Funds
 - Revolving Loan Funds
 - Emergency Community Water Assistance Grants
 - Section 306C Colonias and Tribal Set-Aside Grants
 - Rural Alaskan Native Village Grants
 - Household Water Well System Grants
 - Rural Economic Area Partnership Zone projects.

Any project that receives even \$1 of SRF funding is required to comply with AIS.

Only applies to projects that construct, enlarge, extend or otherwise improve rural water, sanitary sewage, solid waste disposal, and storm wastewater disposal facilities.



EPA

- DC and Territories (except Puerto Rico)
 - However, they may have other domestic preference requirements they have to follow
- Tribes that receive grants from the national SRF set aside
 - However, if a tribe receives a loan from a state SRF program, then the project must comply with AIS
- DWSRF set-aside activities

USDA RD

- Puerto Rico
- Virgin Islands
- Western Pacific Territories

AIS requirements only apply to projects with an assistance agreement signed on or after January 17, 2014.

AIS requirements only apply to projects for which funds were obligated after May 5, 2017.



What Products Are Covered by AIS?



Products Required to Comply with AIS	EPA	USDA RD
Products Made Primarily of Iron or Steel: Products greater than 50% iron or steel, measured by material costs only (not labor, overhead, shipping, etc.	√	√
Listed Products : Lined or unlined pipes and fittings, manhole covers and other municipal castings, hydrants, tanks, flanges, pipe clamps and restraints, valves, structural steel, reinforced precast concrete, and construction materials	√	√
Products permanently incorporated into the project	\checkmark	\checkmark
All manufacturing processes (melting, refining, forming, rolling, drawing, finishing, fabricating, assembly) must take place in the U.S. , except steel additives refining and external coating surface of components.		√
Does NOT apply to raw materials.	\checkmark	\checkmark
Does NOT apply to products primarily iron and/or steel (composed of more than 50 percent) if they are not listed in the Act.	\checkmark	\checkmark

Co-Funded Projects

- Co-funded projects are funded by both EPA and USDA RD
- EPA's State Revolving Funds (SRF)
 - Clean Water SRF
 - Drinking Water SRF
- USDA RD's Rural Utilities Service (RUS) Water and Environmental Programs (WEP)
 - Eight funding programs
- Co-funded projects are required to comply with AIS requirements of both agencies
- AIS requirements are seamless between EPA and USDA RD

Co-Funded Projects: AIS Compliance Requirements



- Documentation of AIS compliance is required by EPA and USDA RD:
 - Include AIS language in assistance agreements, bid documents, construction contracts (this should be standard language)
 - Obtain AIS certification letters for all specified products
 - Specified products that are not documented with an AIS certification letter must be documented with a waiver (national or project specific)
- EPA and USDA RD have authority to waive the AIS requirement and to issue waivers for a case or category of cases.
 - National Waivers
 - Project-Specific Waivers



Co-Funded Projects: AIS Certification Letters

- AIS certification letters should include 5 elements:
 - Products: Identify specific product(s) delivered to project site.
 - Project: Identify the specific project for the delivered product(s)
 - Manufacturing Location: Identify location(s) of foundry/mill/factory where product was manufactured (City and State)
 - Reference AIS requirements:
 - <u>EPA will accept USDA RD AlS reference in</u> letters that cite Section 746 of Title VII of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2017 (Division A Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2017)
 - <u>USDA RD will accept EPA AIS reference in</u> letters that cite American Iron and Steel requirement as mandated in EPA's State Revolving Loan Fund Programs (e.g. Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2014 P.L. 113-76).
 - Signature of Company Representative: Preferably on letterhead

Co-Funded Projects: National Waivers

 National waivers are available for use immediately and do not require EPA or USDA RD approval

Co-Funded Projects: Project-Specific Waiver Requests

- NATE PROTECTO
- Waiver conditions are the <u>same</u> for both EPA and USDA RD funded projects
- Types of project-specific waiver:
 - Availability
 - Public Interest
 - Cost

For project specific waivers where EPA and USDA RD are co-funding, EPA and USDA RD will review said waiver for the co-funded project.

Co-Funded Projects: Project-Specific Waiver Requests



EPA Waiver Application Process

Recipient prepares initial waiver request.

Waiver request is sent to State SRF.

State SRF forwards waiver request to EPA Headquarters. EPA HQ conducts market research, collects public comment, and evaluates information.

EPA HQ approves or disapproves request, informs the State of decision, and publishes decision on EPA AIS website.

USDA RD Waiver Application Process

Recipient prepares initial waiver request.

Waiver request is sent to State Office.

Waiver request is sent to National Office (NO).

NO conducts market research, collects public comment, and evaluates information. NO approves or disapproves request, informs the State of decision, and publishes decision on USDA RD AIS website.

Co-Funded Projects: EPA and USDA RD Project Oversight



Site Visits – Planning and Data Collection

- Schedule site visit early in construction phase
- Ask assistance recipient to informally list AIS materials to be purchased for the project
- Request copies of AIS certification letters prior to site visit
- Consider the site visit a "snapshot in time"

Co-Funded Projects: EPA and USDA RD Project Oversight



Site Visits – On-Site Activities and Deliverable

- Travel to project site during construction phase
- Educate assistance recipient on AIS requirements
- Review checklist, collect AIS documentation, and take photos at the project site
- Determine assistance recipient's AIS compliance approach
 - Are they collecting certification letters with shop drawings? With pay requests?
- Evaluate assistance recipient's compliance with AIS requirements – especially documentation
 - Identify un-certified products before they are installed
- Prepare and submit summary report

Summary

NAME OF TAKES STATES TO ST

- AIS requirements apply to:
 - Any EPA project that receives SRF funding
 - Any USDA RD RUS WEP project that construct, enlarge, extend or otherwise improve rural water, sanitary sewage, solid waste disposal, and storm wastewater disposal facilities.
- Co-Funded projects are required to comply with AIS requirements of both agencies
- AIS requirements for USDA RD projects are essentially the same as EPA projects
- Compliance is easy for borrowers relying on project funding in both USDA RD and EPA programs
