- Over the past quarter EPA offered many ways for the public to get informed and involved including:

 - [Partnered with USDA to improve drinking water systems and develop workforce](#) in rural communities

Greater Transparency: EPA Home and Open Webpage Redesign

- Released interim strategy for developing future microsites and resource directories for the Homepage
- Launched development of twelve new microsites
- Updated and revised EPA's OpenGov webpage (www.epa.gov/open) to make it easier to read our plans, follow our progress, and find our data

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Making More Data Accessible: Chemical and Pesticide Information

Newly Declassified Chemical Information:

- EPA's declassification challenge urged companies to voluntarily declassify some of their Confidential Business Information claims for chemicals subject to the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA)
- A number of companies responded and released health and safety studies

Pesticide Product Label System (PPLS)

- Pesticide product labels provide critical information on how to safely handle and use pesticide products
- EPA recently converted historic labeling information and expanded the Pesticide Product Label System (PPLS) <http://iaspub.epa.gov/apex/pesticides/f?p=101:1:2313594035615863>
- Now over 170,000 labels are searchable by product name, company name, or registration number
- New capability allows you to search within a label (all labels converted to text searchable PDFs)
- Product transfer information is now provided (when a product is transferred to another company)

Culture Change and Training: Community Involvement Conference

Adapting to the 21st Century:

- The July [Community Involvement Conference](#) themes included: Embracing Diversity, Expanding Engagement, Utilizing Technology
- Presenters and panels showcased the current state of community involvement, how it is evolving, and the steps to leverage existing and emerging technologies and techniques
- Over 400 individuals attended in person or through on-line sessions representing federal agencies, state, local, and tribal governments, universities, NGO's, and private industry groups
- Feedback from participants will help shape future events and efforts

Leveraging Partnerships and Technology: FOIA Module Launch

- EPA partnered with Department of Commerce (DoC) and National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) to develop a Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) receipt, processing and repository module
- The team plans to reuse an existing eGov platform to reduce costs for development and maintenance, enable multi-agency use, and provide a public-facing component
- Module will support administration and workflow of FOIA requests and provide access to FOIA requests and responsive documents, enabling processing efficiencies and reuse for agencies and the public
- Team began validating requirements with other federal agencies

Better Metadata: Environmental Data Gateway (EDG)

- EPA's [Environmental Data Gateway \(EDG\)](#) has evolved to also capture and report metadata for datasets destined for Data.gov
- The EDG will begin producing the EPA Data.gov inventory and data dashboard internally (these products will be available to the public by Q3/2011)

Good Information Management Practices: Docket Enhancement

- This quarter, EPA turned on the electronic records management function for EPA's Federal Docket Management System (FDMS), the agency document management portion of *Regulations.gov*
- FDMS is now an official and fully-functioning system of record supporting EPA's docket management activities including rulemaking efforts

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Improved Public Access: Compliance Mapping Tool and Interactive Data Browsing

ECHO Mapping Tool

- In support of the White House Regulatory Compliance Transparency Initiative, EPA provided the public a mapping tool for the [Enforcement Compliance History Online \(ECHO\)](#) system
- The tool allows the public to access federal and state enforcement information interactively and compare information by state
- The map will be refreshed monthly to include up to date information about the enforcement actions taken to address violations of air, water, and waste laws
- ECHO hit the 10 million mark for data queries

Leveraging New Data.gov Interactive Platform

- EPA brought a number of datasets into the new interactive Data.gov platform, including the popular [Toxics Release Inventory \(TRI\)](#) data
- The platform allows you to browse data online, conduct searches, and create and save data visualizations

EPA Recognition: Highlights from the White House report on OpenGov

- In September, the White House released a [status report on OpenGov](#) across the Federal Government
- The President released the report when he went to the United Nations to announce a [Global OpenGov Partnership](#) initiative
- EPA's OpenGov Plan and program were cited favorably, specifically:
 - EPA's FOIA program and success in reducing the FOIA backlog
 - Proactive disclosure via EPA's [My Property](#) tool
 - EPA's Apps for the Environment challenge
 - Regulatory compliance information access
