CONSENT AGREEMENT AND ORDER

1	Complainant, the United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA"), having filed
2	the Complaint herein on [date] against Respondent [Respondent's Name]; and
3	Complainant and Respondent having agreed that settlement of this matter is in the public
4	interest, and that entry of this Consent Agreement and Order without further litigation is the most
5	appropriate means of resolving this matter;
6	NOW, THEREFORE, before the taking of any testimony, upon the pleadings, without
7	adjudication of any issue of fact or law, and upon consent and agreement of the Parties, it is
8	hereby Ordered and Adjudged as follows:
9	I. PRELIMINARY STATEMENT
10	1. EPA initiated this proceeding for the assessment of a civil penalty, pursuant to
11	[statute and regulations].
12	2. The Complaint alleges that Respondent [describe conduct] in violation of [relevant
13	legal requirements].
14	3. Respondent filed an Answer and requested a hearing pursuant to [statute and
15	regulations].
16	4. This Consent Agreement and Order shall apply to and be binding upon Respondent, its
17	officers, directors, employees, successors and assigns, including, but not limited to, subsequent
18	purchasers.
19	5. Respondent stipulates that EPA has jurisdiction over the subject matter alleged in the
20	Complaint and that the Complaint states a claim upon which relief can be granted against
21	Respondent. Respondent waives any defenses it might have as to jurisdiction and venue, and,

1	without admitting or denying the factual allegations contained in the Complaint, consents to the		
2	terms of this Consent Agreement and Order.		
3	6. Respondent hereby waives its right to a judicial or administrative hearing or appeal on any issue of law or fact set forth in the Complete		
4	any issue of law or fact set forth in the Complaint.		
5	II. TERMS OF SETTLEMENT		
б	7. Pursuant to § of [statute], the nature of the violations, Respondent's agreement to		
7	perform a Supplemental Environmental Project (SEP) and other relevant factors, EPA has		
8	determined that an appropriate civil penalty to settle this action is in the amount of		
9	[dollars (\$)].		
10	[Note: In order to avoid conflicts with the Miscellaneous Receipts Act, the civil		
11	penalty provisions must be drafted separately from the provisions for		
12	implementation of the SEP.]		
13	8. Respondent consents to the issuance of this Consent Agreement and consents for the		
14	purposes of settlement to the payment of the civil penalty cited in the foregoing paragraph and to		
15	the performance of the Supplemental Environmental Project.		
16	[Note: Remember that the Respondent must consent to the issuance of the Final

18	9. Not more than thirty (30) days after the date of issuance of the executed Consent Order

20	certified check, payable to the order of the "Treasurer, United States of America," in the amount

34	a. Respondent shall complete the following supplemental environmental project		
35	("SEP"), which the parties agree is intended to secure significant environmental or public health		
36	protection and improvements. Not more than (30) days after receiving a copy of this Consent		
37	Agreement signed by the Regional Administrator, Respondent shall [brief description of SEP].		
38	b. Respondent shall complete the SEP as follows: [Identify key components of the		
39	SEP]. The SEP is more specifically described in the scope of work (hereinafter, the "Scope of		
40	Work"), attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

[Cost of SEP] The total expenditure for the SEP shall be not less than [e.g., \$x to purchase the equipment and \$y to operate the equipment each year for z years], in 14 15 accordance with the specifications set forth in the Scope of Work. Respondent shall include documentation of the expenditures made in connection with the SEP as part of the SEP 16 Completion Report. 17
- 14. [Certifications that SEP is not otherwise required] Respondent hereby certifies 18 19 that, as of the date of this Consent Agreement, Respondent is not required to perform or develop the SEP by any federal, state or local law or regulation; nor is Respondent required to perform or 20 develop the SEP by any other agreement, grant or as injunctive relief in this or any other case. 21 Respondent further certifies that it has not received, and is not presently negotiating to receive, 22 credit in any other enforcement action for the SEP. 23
- 24 [Note: This language emphasizes that the SEP is not required by any other law (federal, state or local); nor is it required by any other agreement, grant or as 25 injunctive relief in the instant or any other case. In addition, the language 26 precludes Respondent from attempting to obtain double credit for the same 27 project. Also, Respondent cannot be allowed to "bank" projects (i.e., Respondent 28 is not to be given credit for projects it has already commenced or completed in 29 advance of the enforcement action by EPA.)] 30

- SEP Completion Report Respondent shall submit a SEP Completion Report to 32 a. EPA by [date]. The SEP (Completion) Report shall contain the following information: 33 A detailed description of the SEP as implemented; 34 (i) A description of any operating problems encountered and the solutions thereto; 35 (ii) (iii) Itemized costs: 36 37
 - (iv) Certification that the SEP has been fully implemented pursuant to the provisions of this Consent Agreement and Order; and
- A description of the environmental and public health benefits resulting from (v) 39 implementation of the SEP (with a quantification of the benefits and pollutant 40 reductions, if feasible). 41

1 b. Periodic Reports Respondent shall submit any additional reports required by the Scope of Work to EPA in accordance with the schedule and requirements recited therein. (Note: 2 For any SEP where implementation is expected to exceed one year, EPA should require 3 submission of periodic reports by Respondent). 4

- Respondent agrees that failure to submit the SEP Completion Report or any 5 c. Periodic Report required by subsections a) and b) above shall be deemed a violation of this б Consent Agreement and Order and Respondent shall become liable for stipulated penalties 7 pursuant to paragraph 20 below. 8
- 9

d. Respondent shall submit all notices and reports required by this Consent Agreement and Order to [specify name and address] by first class mail. 10

In itemizing its costs in the SEP completion report, Respondent shall clearly 11 e. identify and provide acceptable documentation for all eligible SEP costs. Where the SEP 12 completion report includes costs not eligible for SEP credit, those costs must be clearly identified 13 as such. For purposes of this Paragraph, "acceptable documentation" includes invoices, 14 purchase orders, or other documentation that specifically identifies and itemizes the individual 15 costs of the goods and/or services for which payment is being made. Canceled drafts do not 16 constitute acceptable documentation unless such drafts specifically identify and itemize the 17 individual costs of the goods and/or services for which payment is being made. 18

[If applicable] 16. [EPA right to inspect] Respondent agrees that EPA may inspect the 19 facility at any time in order to confirm that the SEP is being undertaken in conformity with the 20 representations made herein. 21

[Note: Consistent with the provisions below for Failure to Complete SEP and 22 EPA To Judge Achievement of SEP, this language provides vehicle for EPA to 23 exercise its discretion in determining if SEP has been completed satisfactorily and 24 whether stipulated penalties should be assessed.] 25

[If applicable:] 17. [Respondent must use SEP] Respondent shall continuously use or 26 operate the systems installed as the SEP for not less than [number] year(s) subsequent to 27 installation, and Respondent shall not reinstate the use of [eliminated chemical] at any time. 28

18. [Document retention and certification] Respondent shall maintain legible copies 29 of documentation of the underlying research and data for any and all documents or reports 30 submitted to EPA pursuant to this Consent Agreement and shall provide the documentation of 31 any such underlying research and data to EPA not more than seven days after a request for such 32 information. In all documents or reports, including, without limitation, any SEP reports, 33 submitted to EPA pursuant to this Consent Agreement, Respondent shall, by its officers, sign and 34 35 certify under penalty of law that the information contained in such document or report is true, accurate, and not misleading by signing the following statement: 36

I certify under penalty of law that I have examined and am familiar with 37 38 the information submitted in this document and all attachments and that, based on my inquiry of those individuals immediately responsible for obtaining the 39 information, I believe that the information is true, accurate, and complete. I am 40

1 2 aware that there are significant penalties for submitting false information, including the possibility of fines and imprisonment.

19. [EPA acceptance of SEP Report]

a. After receipt of the SEP Completion Report described in paragraph 15.a above,
EPA will notify the Respondent, in writing, regarding: i) any deficiencies in the SEP Report itself
along with a grant of an additional thirty (30) days for Respondent to correct any deficiencies; or
(ii) indicate that EPA concludes that the project has been completed satisfactorily or (iii)
determine that the project has not been completed satisfactorily and seek stipulated penalties in
accordance with paragraph 20 herein.

If EPA elects to exercise option (i) above, i.e., if the SEP Report is determined to b. 10 be deficient but EPA has not yet made a final determination about the adequacy of SEP 11 completion itself, EPA shall permit Respondent the opportunity to object in writing to the 12 notification of deficiency given pursuant to this paragraph within ten (10) days of receipt of such 13 notification. EPA and Respondent shall have an additional thirty (30) days from the receipt by 14 EPA of the notification of objection to reach agreement on changes necessary to the SEP Report. 15 If agreement cannot be reached on any such issue within this thirty (30) day period, EPA shall 16 provide a written statement of its decision on adequacy of the completion of the SEP to 17 Respondent, which decision shall be final and binding upon Respondent. Respondent agrees to 18 comply with any requirements imposed by EPA as a result of any failure to comply with the 19 terms of this Consent Agreement and Order. In the event the SEP is not completed as 20 contemplated herein, as determined by EPA, stipulated penalties shall be due and payable by 21 Respondent to EPA in accordance with paragraph 20 herein. 22

20. [Stipulated Penalties for Failure to Complete SEP/Failure to spend agreed-on amount]

a. In the event that Respondent fails to comply with any of the terms or provisions of
this Agreement relating to the performance of the SEP described in paragraph 11 above and/or to
the extent that the actual expenditures for the SEP do not equal or exceed the cost of the SEP
described in paragraph 13 above, Respondent shall be liable for stipulated penalties according to
the provisions set forth below:

- (i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) immediately below, for a SEP which has
 not been completed satisfactorily pursuant to this Consent Agreement and Order,
 Respondent shall pay a stipulated penalty to the United States in the amount of \$ [EPA
 to set a number 75 150 percent of the amount by which the settlement penalty was
 mitigated on account of the SEP].
- (ii) If the SEP is not completed in accordance with paragraphs [X-Y], but the
 Complainant determines that the Respondent: a) made good faith and timely efforts to
 complete the project; and b) certifies, with supporting documentation, that at least 90
 percent of the amount of money which was required to be spent was expended on the
 SEP, Respondent shall not be liable for any stipulated penalty.
- (iii) If the SEP is completed in accordance with paragraphs [X-Y], but the Respondent
 spent less than 90 percent of the amount of money required to be spent for the project,
 Respondent shall pay a stipulated penalty to the United States in the amount of \$ [10 25]

1	percent of the amount by which the settlement penalty was mitigated on account of
2	the SEP].
3	(iv) If the SEP is completed in accordance with paragraphs [X-Y], and the Respondent
4	spent at least 90 percent of the amount of money required to be spent for the project,
5	Respondent shall not be liable for any stipulated penalty.
6	(v) For failure to submit the SEP Completion Report required by paragraph 15(a)
7	above, Respondent shall pay a stipulated penalty in the amount of \$[amount] for each
8	day after [date in paragraph 15] until the report is submitted.
9	(vi) For failure to submit any other report required by paragraph 15(b) above,
10	Respondent shall pay a stipulated penalty in the amount of \$[amount] for each day after
11	the report was originally due until the report is submitted.
12	b. The determinations of whether the SEP has been satisfactorily completed and
13	whether the Respondent has made a good faith, timely effort to implement the SEP shall be in the
14	sole discretion of EPA.
15	c. Stipulated penalties for subparagraphs (v) and (vi) above shall begin to accrue on
16	the day after performance is due, and shall continue to accrue through the final day of the
17	completion of the activity.
18	d. Respondent shall pay stipulated penalties not more than fifteen (15) days after
19	receipt of written demand by EPA for such penalties. Method of payment shall be in accordance
20	with the provisions of paragraph 9 above. Interest and late charges shall be paid as stated in
21	paragraph 21 herein.
22	e. Nothing in this agreement shall be construed as prohibiting, altering or in any way
23	limiting the ability of EPA to seek any other remedies or sanctions available by virtue of
24	Respondent's violation of this agreement or of the statutes and regulations upon which this
25	agreement is based, or for Respondent's violation of any applicable provision of law.
26	[Note: Language included for payment of an additional penalty for non-completion of
27	SEP or failure to expend amount of funds committed to in Consent Agreement must not
28	appear to give EPA a choice between: 1) collection of an additional penalty; or 2)
29	additional SEP expenditures by Respondent. Such a provision might appear to give EPA
30	control or discretion over the use of penalty dollars. Unlike a SEP, all assessed penalty
31	dollars must be deposited in the Treasury.]
32	21. Payment Provisions Pursuant to 31 U.S.C. § 3717, EPA is entitled to assess
33	interest and penalties on debts owed to the United States and a charge to cover the cost of
34	processing and handling a delinquent claim. Interest will therefore begin to accrue on a civil or
35	stipulated penalty if it is not paid by the last date required. Interest will be assessed at the rate of
26	the United States Traceury tay and lean rate in accordance with $4 C = P = 8 102 12(a)$. A charge

the United States Treasury tax and loan rate in accordance with 4 C.F.R. § 102.13(c). A charge will be assessed to cover the costs of debt collection, including processing and handling costs and attorneys fees. In addition, a non-payment penalty charge of six (6) percent per year compounded annually will be assessed on any portion of the debt which remains delinquent more than ninety (90) days after payment is due. Any such non-payment penalty charge on the debt will accrue from the date the penalty payment becomes due and is not paid. 4 C.F.R. §§ 102.13(d) and (e).

[Note: Penalty and interest provisions and recovery of attorneys fees may vary by statute. If appropriate, substitute a statute-specific collection authority in this

paragraph. The maximum non-payment penalty charge is six (6) percent unless a
 statute specifically provides otherwise.]

22. [Public statements must acknowledge enforcement action] Any public statement,
 oral or written, in print, film, or other media, made by Respondent making reference to the SEP
 shall include the following language, "This project was undertaken in connection with the
 settlement of an enforcement action taken by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for
 violations of [citation to legal requirements violated]."

8 23. **[No relief from compliance; no endorsement by EPA]** This Consent Agreement 9 and Order shall not relieve Respondent of its obligation to comply with all applicable provisions 10 of federal, state or local law, nor shall it be construed to be a ruling on, or determination of, any 11 issue related to any federal, state or local permit, nor shall it be construed to constitute EPA 12 approval of the equipment or technology installed by Respondent in connection with the SEP 13 undertaken pursuant to this Agreement.

24. [Force Majeure--if appropriate and requested by Respondent]

If any event occurs which causes or may cause delays in the completion of the 15 a. SEP as required under this Agreement, Respondent shall notify Complainant in writing not more 16 than 10 days after the delay or Respondent's knowledge of the anticipated delay, whichever is 17 earlier. The notice shall describe in detail the anticipated length of the delay, the precise cause or 18 causes of the delay, the measures taken and to be taken by Respondent to prevent or minimize the 19 delay, and the timetable by which those measures will be implemented. The Respondent shall 20 adopt all reasonable measures to avoid or minimize any such delay. Failure by Respondent to 21 comply with the notice requirements of this paragraph shall render this paragraph void and of no 22 effect as to the particular incident involved and constitute a waiver of the Respondent's right to 23 request an extension of its obligation under this Agreement based on such incident. 24

b. If the parties agree that the delay or anticipated delay in compliance with this
Agreement has been or will be caused by circumstances entirely beyond the control of
Respondent, the time for performance hereunder may be extended for a period no longer than the
delay resulting from such circumstances. In such event, the parties shall stipulate to such
extension of time.

c. In the event that the EPA does not agree that a delay in achieving compliance with
 the requirements of this Consent Agreement and Order has been or will be caused by
 circumstances beyond the control of the Respondent, EPA will notify Respondent in writing of
 its decision and any delays in the completion of the SEP shall not be excused.

d. The burden of proving that any delay is caused by circumstances entirely beyond the control of the Respondent shall rest with the Respondent. Increased costs or expenses associated with the implementation of actions called for by this Agreement shall not, in any event, be a basis for changes in this Agreement or extensions of time under section (b) of this paragraph. Delay in achievement of one interim step shall not necessarily justify or excuse delay in achievement of subsequent steps.

25. [If Respondent has agreed that it will not treat the cost of performing the SEP as a 1 business expense to be deducted for purposes of federal taxes, and the tax rate in the PROJECT 2 computer model was thus set at zero, include this paragraph. If not, exclude this paragraph.] 3 Respondent hereby agrees not to claim any funds expended in the performance of the SEP as a 4 deductible business expense for purposes of Federal taxes. In addition, Respondent hereby 5 agrees that, within thirty (30) days of the date it submits its Federal tax reports for the calendar 6 year in which the above-identified SEP is completed, it will submit to EPA [identify EPA 7 official] certification that any funds expended in the performance of the SEP have not been 8 deducted from Federal taxes. 9 10

- 11 26. This Consent Agreement and Order constitutes a settlement by EPA of all claims for 12 civil penalties pursuant to **[cite statute]** for the violations alleged in the Complaint. Nothing in 13 this Consent Agreement and Order is intended to nor shall be construed to operate in any way to 14 resolve any criminal liability of the Respondent. Compliance with this Consent Agreement and 15 Order shall not be a defense to any actions subsequently commenced pursuant to Federal laws 16 and regulations administered by EPA, and it is the responsibility of Respondent to comply with 17 such laws and regulations.
- 18 27. Each undersigned representative of the parties to this Consent Agreement certifies 19 that he or she is fully authorized by the party represented to enter into the terms and conditions of 20 this Consent Agreement and to execute and legally bind that party to it.
- 21 28. Each party shall bear its own costs and attorneys fees in connection with the action 22 resolved by this Consent Agreement and Order.
