Recap of GGE Phase 1

Purpose

- Evaluate what works/does not work with the 2013 GAP Guidance
- ▶ Identify opportunities for improvement

Timeline

- Initiated Spring 2018
- Established EPA National Tribal Caucus (NTC) GGE workgroup
- Tribal Consultation
 - ▶ Over 800 individual tribal comments, 40 letters
- ► Internal input Fall 2018
- Consultation on Phase 1 closed Jan 2020
 - ► EPA will provide individual letter responses and general response to comments with Final Guidance

What did we hear?

- OITA needs to follow-through on national performance tracking and reporting without shifting burden to tribes
- Improve clarity and national consistency; minimize admin. workload (ETEPs, indicators)
- Increase flexibility so that tribes can focus on what is most important to them; do not treat all tribes the same
- Do not impose restrictions on GAP funds that are not required by the GAP Act; interpret the Act broadly
- Rescind the 2013 Guidance and use 2006 Guidance as starting point for revisions/improvements
- Provide GAP funding for program implementation beyond waste programs
- Remove burdensome documentation requirements for intertribal consortia
- Clarify the connection between GAP Guidance and Performance Partnership Grant
- Add Service Delivery per 2018 Appropriations authority

Path Forward - GGE Phase 2

Purpose

- EPA and Tribes work collaboratively on revisions, leading to efficient, effective, and flexible administration of GAP
- Revision will be led by AIEO, with clear guidance on AIEO decisions ("bright lines")

Timeline

- Starts now
- New Workgroups July 2021 October 2021
- ► Tribal Consultation December 2021 February 2022
- Final Revised Guidance March 2022
- Training April 2022 September 2022
- Implementation October 1, 2022



Consultation - GAP Allocation

- AIEO Priority National Allocation
 - Are we addressing the high priority needs in Indian country?
 - Office of Inspector General (OIG) recommendations from 2008
- July 19 November 16, 2021
 - Informational call August 2021
 - Regional consultation webinars
 - Consortia webinar
 - Regional Tribal Operations Committee (RTOC) and Tribal Partnership Group (TPG) discussions
 - ▶ Will accept individual requests for Consultation
 - ► In-person Consultation not yet possible

GAP Allocation

- What is the existing national GAP allocation process?
 - ► AIEO receives the appropriation from Congress
 - National AIEO set-asides, if any, determined and reserved
 - Allocations to regions are determined as \$110,000 x # of federally regulated tribes in region
 - Remaining balance is divided equally by # of GAP recipients and added to regional allocation

GAP Allocation

► For FY21

- \$66,250,000 GAP Appropriation
- Minus AIEO set-aside of \$250,000 (Indian Health Service Interagency Agreement) = \$66,000,000
- \$66,000,000 minus (583 tribes x \$110,000/per tribe) = \$1,870,000
- \$1,870,000/513 GAP recipients = \$3,645.22/recipient
- Regions distribute the funds based on regional specific criteria
- EPA staff are not paid by GAP

GGE Phase 2 Timeline - Big Picture

- GAP Guidance Revisions (Workgroups) July through October
- Allocation consultation July through November
- Internal drafting of final revised Guidance and allocation -Nov/Dec
- Tribal consultation on final revised Guidance and allocation
 - ▶ December 2021 through February 2022
- Final Guidance and allocation issued March 2022
- ► Training (internal, external) April through September 2022
- ► Final Guidance and Allocation effective October 1, 2022
